- 703k total sq. feet for exhibits
- 77 customizable meeting rooms
- \$4M art collection

- Metro accessible
- Heart of downtown DC
- Name changed 2007



Carnegie Library at Mt. Vernon Square



- Opened 1903
- 75k total sq. feet of event space
- Nine ornate rooms
- Reopened as event space 2012

- Dedicated by Theodore Roosevelt and Andrew Carnegie
- Metro accessible
- Heart of downtown DC



RFK Stadium



- Opened 1961
- 45,423 capacity
- 19,647 MLS (D.C. United) capacity
- Natural grass playing field

- Modern amenities and club rooms
- Parking for 10,000 cars
- Metro accessible
- Renamed RFK Stadium 1969



DC Armory



- Opened 1941
- 70k sq. feet of exhibit space
- 10k seating for sports and theater
- 4.5k seating for cabaret/formal

- Modernized amenities
- Parking for 10,000 cars
- Metro accessible



Gateway DC



- 40,400 non-contiguous sq. feet
- Open-air and covered pavilion
- 10,000+ capacity throughout
- Fully-equipped test kitchen

- Indoor café with floor to ceiling windows
- Metro accessible
- Parking available



Maloo Skate Park at RFK Stadium

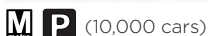


- Opened 2011

RFK Festival Grounds



- 110 acres
- Includes 10 parking lots

- Open-air grounds for large-scale festivals and concerts

- Opened 2008
