Walter E. Washington Convention Center

- Opened in 2003
- Name changed to Walter E. Washington Convention Center (2007)
- 703,000 total sq. feet of exhibit space
 - 77 individual/customizable meeting rooms
- \$4 million art collection
- Metro accessible/heart of downtown DC (designated metro station)

Carnegie Library at Mt. Vernon Square

- Opened in 1903
- Dedicated by Theodore Roosevelt and Andrew Carnegie
- 75,000 sq. feet of event space
- Nine ornate rooms
- Reopened as a special event space in 2012
- Metro accessible/heart of downtown DC (designated metro station)

RFK Stadium

_

- Opened as the District of Columbia Stadium on October 1, 1961
- Renamed as Robert F. Kennedy Memorial Stadium on January 18, 1969
- Seating capacity: 45,423
- Seating capacity (D.C. United MLS games): 19,647
- Natural Grass playing field
- Modern locker rooms and lounge areas
- Club rooms for private and group affairs
- Metro accessible
- Parking for over 10,000 cars
- Open air arena for large-scale civic events

DC Armory

- Opened in 1941 as the DC National Guard Armory
- 70,000 sq. feet of exhibition space
- 10,000 seating capacity for sports and theater events
- 4,500 seating capacity for cabaret and formal events
- Two modernized lockers
- Metro accessible
- Parking for over 10,000 cars

RFK Festival Grounds

- 11 acres
- Includes 10 parking lots
- 1.7 mile race track
- Open air grounds for large-scale festivals and concerts
- Parking for over 10,000 cars
- Metro accessible

Maloof Skate Park at RFK Stadium

- Opened in 2011
- 15,000 sq. feet
- Open year-round from dawn to dusk
- Inspired by DC's Freedom Plaza and Pennsylvania Ave.

Nationals Park

- Opened in 2008
- Seating capacity: 41,546
- First major stadium to receive U.S. Leed Certification
- Recipient of the U.S. Green Building Council's "Silver Status"
- Natural playing grass
- Metro accessible
