


- Good morning!

- We hosted the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute Awards Gala. 18 hundred people attended.

- Lastly, the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation Annual Legislative Conference was a success with 12 thousand four hundred attendees filling the Convention Center.


- In September, we hosted 10 events at the RFK Campus and in the St. Elizabeth's community for more than 14 thousand 500 people.
